## Why use Auckland Regional HealthPathways?

There will be times when use of a clinical pathway will add value to clinician and/or patient, examples include:

- where there has been a recent change to the management of a condition e.g. availability of new medications, service configuration
- where the clinician is not sure of the next step and wants to avoid potential time wasting with out of date practice and investigations
- to avoid the frustration of having referrals declined
- to support orientation of new clinicians, including Doctors. Nurses and others
- as a teaching tool for GPs, GP Registrars, Nurses and undergraduates
- as a point of care rapid resource when treating complex conditions, a ready reference
- Auckland Regional HealthPathways are faster than using Google and are locally agreed practice for the metro Auckland region
- to identify local resources to support patients' conditions, self-care resourcing and support from secondary care when needed

Auckland Regional HealthPathways is part of an international community of clinicians working to share evidence based, best practice information for primary care that is adapted for the metro Auckland region. Members of the community include teams in other parts of NZ, Australia, Canada and the UK.

Auckland Regional HealthPathways are used by Health Professionals (Doctors, Nurses etc.) within the primary care team to access regionally agreed processes for management of patients presenting to primary care teams.
